

### INTRODUCTION

The Directorate General of Training (D.G.T.), New Delhi in the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (M.S.D.E.) is the apex organization for laying down standards and norms, developing curriculum, granting affiliasion, carrying out assessment and certification for the trades or courses offered under various vocational training programmes/ schemes through the 15,000 plus Industrial Training Institutes (I.T.I.s) across the country. The I.T.I.s in each State/Union Territory are governed by the respective Directorates of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship.

In Goa, there are 10 Government and 03 Private I.T.I.s functioning under the Directorate of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (D.S.D.E.). These I.T.I.s offer 44 different Engineering and Non-engineering trades/courses under the flagship Craftsmen Training Scheme (C.T.S.) of D.G.T. Most of these trades are affiliated to the National Council for Vocational Training (N.C.V.T.), New Delhi and few are affiliated to the State Council for Vocational Training (S.C.V.T.), Government of Goa. However, training in the S.C.V.T. affiliated trades is imparted in par with the N.C.V.T. trades by following the same training syllabus, schedule, calendar, methodology and examination pattern as approved by D.G.T. and M.S.D.E.; only examinations and certifications are done at the State level. By imparting Industrial training, the I.T.I.s ensure a steady flow of skilled workers for the industries.

## INFRASTRUCTURE OF I.T.I.s

Every I.T.I. has good workshops and classrooms for imparting training, a library, an office, separate washrooms for male and female staff and trainees, drinking water facility and other basic necessities required in an institution as per the prescribed norms of the Government. Apart from the regular training setup, most of the Government I.T.I.s are provided with Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Thinking Labs, Digital Language Labs and C.C.T.V. cameras for surveillance. The Thinking labs are useful for the I.T.I. trainees as well as the school students visiting the I.T.I.s to upgrade their knowledge and skills.

## JOINING I.T.I. AS A "REGULAR TRAINEE" OR AS A "PRIVATE CANDIDATE"

A candidate willing to join an I.T.I. for undergoing training in a long-term or short-term course under the Craftman Training Scheme (C.T.S.), may take admission as a "Regular Trainee" or as a "Private Candidate".

If a candidate desires to pursue a full-time course, he/she has to take admission in any of the Government or Private I.T.I.s as a "Regular Trainee". The online admission process for such course normally starts from the month of April/May every year and the admission schedule is published in the local newspapers and uploaded on the admission portal and on D.S.E. and each I.T.I.'s website.

If a candidate who has not undergone formal institutionalized skill training desires to only appear for the All India Trade Test (AITT) of a particular trade, he/she has to check admissibility for a particular trade as per the categories specified in D.S.T. guidelines available at <https://dgc.gov.in/node/1003> and take admission as a "Private Candidate" as per eligibility and admission criteria in any of the Government I.T.I.s only. The admission process for "Private Candidate" normally starts six months prior to the AITT as per the schedule decided by D.S.T. and the seats are limited.

## INFORMATION USEFUL FOR "REGULAR TRAINEES"

Every I.T.I. is headed by a Principal and the training activities are supervised by a Group InSTRUCTOR (G.I.) or a Headnight Foreman or a Surveyor. The teacher imparting training in an I.T.I. is called Vocational Instructor (V.I.) and the candidate admitted in an I.T.I. is called "Trainee". The courses conducted at the I.T.I.s are referred to as "Trades".

## WORKING HOURS

The Directorate of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and the Industrial Training Institutes (I.T.I.) in GEP follow the day-wise-work pattern working from Monday to Friday and have holidays on the days as declared by the Government of Goa.

However, whenever the trainees are deployed in the industries for undergoing training under the On-Job Training (OJT) or Dual System of Training (D.S.T.) component of the syllabus or otherwise, they have to strictly follow the industry timings and work-week.

The D.S.E. Head Office telefax 0830 a.m. to 0845 p.m. office timings.

The I.T.I.s function in two shifts and observe the following timings:

- (i) 1<sup>st</sup> shift: 08:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. including 1½-hour lunch break
- (ii) 2<sup>nd</sup> shift: 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. including 1½-hour lunch break

The training activities are conducted during either of the shifts, while the office follows the 2<sup>nd</sup> shift timings.

#### **LEAVES ADMISSIBLE TO "REGULAR TRAINEES"**

The trainees studying at the I.T.I.s are trained in an industrial environment and provided with following types of leaves which can be availed during exigencies with prior approval of the Trade (I./G.)/Principal as applicable:

- (i) **Casual leave:** 12 days casual leaves per year subject to a maximum of 10 days at a time.
- (ii) **Medical leave:** 15 days medical leave in case of illness duly supported with medical documents issued by a registered Medical Practitioner. A further period not exceeding 2 weeks for one-year trades and 6 weeks for two-years trades can be granted in continuation or in addition to 15 days absence on medical grounds.
- (iii) **Special leave:** upto 10 days special leave on private affairs. This limit can be further extended to 15 days or 30 days if supported with proper justification and subject to the satisfaction of the Head of the Institute on the basis of genuine reasons. However, no scholarship will be admissible during the period of special leave to a trainee who is a scholarship holder.

#### **TRANSPORT FACILITY**

Bus services is available at Garam, Panaji, Farmagudi, Vasco, Margao, Carera and Canacona Government I.T.I.s for the trainees on payment of Rs. 5/- per trip (concessional rate) from the nearest bus stand to the I.T.I. and back. A monthly pass system is also available for the trainees to use transport facility on payment of Rs 120/- per month at a concessional rate.

Transport facility is presently not available in any of the Private I.T.I.s.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS AND TOOLKITS OFFERED TO TRAINEES**

##### **IN GOVERNMENT I.T.I.s**

Trainees undergoing training at the Government I.T.I.s can avail the following scholarships/benefits on fulfillment of eligibility criteria:

- A. **Merit Scholarship** at the rate of Rs 250/- per month per trainee is awarded to 40% of the actually admitted trainees on strength in each month/shift of a trade irrespective of the intake capacity of a trade on the basis of:
  - (i) Marks scored at the Merit Scholarship Internal test conducted by each I.T.I.
  - (ii) Assessment of the seasonal work, discipline and punctuality for three months after admissions.
- B. **Financial Assistance Scholarship (FAS) and Trainee's Toolkit** is awarded to the trainees residing in the State of Goa for a period not less than 10 years preceding the date of application for admission in I.T.I. and fulfilling other eligibility criteria with respect to each benefit as mentioned below:

- (i) **Financial Assistance Scholarship (FAS)** at the rate of **Rs 600/- per month** per trainee belonging to either: (1) Scheduled Caste (SC) category OR (2) Scheduled Tribe (ST) category OR (3) Below Poverty Level (BPL) Person with Disability (PwD) OR (4) Having an annual income of family less than **Rs 3,00,000/-** which is to be proved by submitting valid Income Certificate issued by (1) Concerned Village Panchayat Secretary under the respective Panchayat area duly attested by the Sarpanch of the concerned Village Panchayat OR (2) Chief Officer of the respective Municipal Council OR (3) Mamdar of the concerned Taluka OR (4) District Collector/Magistrate, provided he/she fills up the FAS form and submits it to the I.T.I. office along with supporting documents and bank account details within 15 days of joining the respective I.T.I.

\* No trainee shall be deemed benefits under this scheme if he/she is not able to produce voter card indicating B.P.L. category. The trainee may instead be requested to produce valid income certificate.

- (ii) **Trainee's Toolkit** containing trade related items costing not more than **Rs 2000/-** collectively can be claimed by a trainee belonging to SC or ST category provided he/she fills up the Trainee's Toolkit form and submits it to the I.T.I. office along with supporting documents within 15 days of joining the respective I.T.I.

#### **Recovery of Benefits Granted to Trainees under Financial Assistance Scholarship and Trainee's Toolkit Scheme:**

The FAS and Trainee's Toolkit granted to a trainee are liable to be cancelled/forfeited/recovered/discontinued if the concerned trainee:

- (i) is found to have committed an act of indiscipline or misconduct vis-a-vis being of an I.T.I. trainee.
- (ii) discontinues training during the course of the year for which the benefit was awarded. In such a case, the trainee will have to pay the actual cost of the Trainee's Toolkit.
- (iii) is found to have furnished incorrect or false information or fake documents OR if the award/benefit has been obtained by suppressing any material facts.

However, the final decision on the recoveries to be made if any shall be at the discretion of the Director, (GSEI).

#### **IN PRIVATE I.T.I.s**

Some Private I.T.I.s award Merit Scholarships to deserving trainees based on merit and financial status of their family.

#### **IN GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE I.T.I.s BY OTHER ORGANIZATIONS**

The trainees studying at the Government and Private I.T.I.s and belonging to certain categories can also apply and avail the benefits / financial assistance / scholarships awarded by other organizations or Government Departments like Directorate of Social Welfare, Directorate of Tribal Welfare and Directorate of Education, provided they meet the eligibility criteria and subject to permission being granted by the particular Organization/Department for availing scholarships/assistance from multiple sources.

## CONCESSIONS

### IN GOVERNMENT I.T.I.s:

- (i) Payment of only 50% of Online Application Processing Fee by the SC, ST, \*Orphan OR \*Severely Children category candidates on producing relevant documents as proof in comparison to other category candidates.
  - (ii) Exemption from payment of tuition fees for candidates who belong to/are Scheduled Caste (SC) OR Scheduled Tribe (ST) OR \*Orphans OR \*Severely Children OR Below Poverty Level OR a family having annual family income of less than Rs. 3,00,000\* p.a. However, the trainee's name should be mentioned on the income certificate which is valid for only six months from the date of issue.
- \* Candidates who claim to be orphans/ destitute children, and their caretakers/guardians have to submit duly filled self-declaration certificate in **Annexure III** format as appended at the end of this Prospectus.
- (iii) Provision of free uniform and boiler suit/workshop clothing material to all the trainees; however, the stitching charges have to be borne by the trainees. The uniforms should be stitched strictly as per the pattern provided by the I.T.I. authorities within 15 days of issuing the cloth material.
  - (iv) Free transport facility for trainees belonging to Scheduled Tribes OR Scheduled Caste category.
  - (v) Free facilities for recreation, library, sports, etc. as available in respective I.T.I.

### IN PRIVATE I.T.I.s

#### (i) DDA PRIVATE I.T.I.

- (i) Provides food at subsidised rates.
- (ii) Provides assistance for job placement in reputed industry.

#### (ii) HENTFORT PRIVATE I.T.I.

- (i) Hostel facility is available in the I.T.I. campus to accommodate trainees who are \*orphans OR do not have any family support OR are from distant places.
- (ii) Other concessions as decided by the Institute are provided to the trainees depending on their family background and annual income.

The trainees should take advantage of the Department's strong connect with various Industries, put in hard work during training, represent a good behavior while at the Institute and in the Industry, learn all skills thoroughly and make himself/herself capable of securing a good job during the placement/job fairs and Pradhan Mantri Apprenticeship Scheme conducted quarterly/semi-annually (as per specific Industry's requirement by the Department/respective I.T./a).

**Note:**

- (i) Online Admission/Application Processing Fee, Tuition fee and Caution Money Deposit has to be paid while submitting the Application Form online.
- (ii) Identity Card amount has to be paid after admission in respective I.T.I.
- (iii) The Caution Money Deposit is collected to guard against losses or damages, if any made to the equipments or tools issued to a trainee during the course of training. A second deposit may also be collected in case the previous amount is exhausted. This amount will be refunded:
  - a. On satisfactory completion of the course in case the trainee does not exhaust it during the training and claims it within six months of completion of training.
  - b. If a candidate withdraws his/her admission within one month from the date of admission.
- (iv) Candidates seeking admission under I.M.C. quota at State Government I.T.I. will have to pay Rs. 8000/- per annum in addition to the fees mentioned in the table above.
- (v) Admission fees should be paid through online mode only using Paytm / Google Pay / PhonePe/ Debit card / Credit card / Net banking, etc.

**EXAMINATION FEE**

The trainee eligible to appear for the Annual pattern of examination conducted on completion of 6 months, 1 year and 2 years training period of the respective trade under the Draftsman Training Scheme (D.T.S.) or Dual System of Training (D.S.T.) scheme shall have to pay an examination fee as mentioned below:

Note: Computer Based Test (C.B.T.) fees as applicable shall be intimated later as per the D.G.T. guidelines for N.C.V.T. examination.

### IDENTITY CARD

After admission, every I.T.I. will issue an Identity Card to the trainee on payment of Rs. 100/- to the respective Government I.T.I., and an amount decided by the respective Private I.T.I. Every trainee should display the I.D. card on person while at the Institute and during visits to Industries, programs, etc.

In case of loss of an I.D. card, a duplicate I.D. card will be issued on production of (i) An affidavit (ii) F.I.R. copy (iii) Latest photograph and (iv) Amount of Rs.100/-.

### DISCIPLINE

All the trainees are required to strictly follow the rules and regulations laid down by D.G.T. and the Directions/Instructions issued by the Director of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and the Principal of respective I.T.I. with regards to the conduct and discipline of trainees. Further, they are required to follow the strict dress, training schedule, time-table issued by the Institute and represent a good behavior while inside the I.T.I. campus. They shall not use abusive language or indulge in any sort of arguments or fights with fellow trainees or staff of I.T.I. or general public. However, in case there is slightest of altercation or disagreement or dispute with any one, they shall immediately inform their instructor/supervisor/instructor/principal while in the I.T.I. and their parents/guardians when outside the I.T.I.

If any trainee is found exhibiting any form of indiscipline, necessary action as deemed fit will be taken by the Competent Authority.

In addition to above, the trainees should adhere to the following instructions:

#### + UNIFORM

Trainees should strictly be in the uniform / boiler suit / overcoat (to be worn as applicable in the classroom/workshop) attached as per the standard pattern provided by the Department while they are in the I.T.I. or deputed in the Industries/hotel. They should strictly not wear any additional attire/ head gear like scarf, bandana, hood, etc. while in the I.T.I. or in the Industry/hotel.

#### **♦ GROOMING**

Male trainees should maintain short hair with decent hair-cut. Clean shaven or well shaven beard and not wear stubs or earrings. Female trainees should wear decent, proper fitting clothes and not wear tight fitting, chain and deep necked clothes.

#### **♦ MOBILE PHONE**

Trainees should not use mobile phones, blue tooth earphones, earbuds, headphones or other similar electronic gadgets while in the L.T.I premises, especially in the classroom and in the section/workshop because the same will be confiscated by the Instructor/Group Instructor/Principal and returned only after completion of course.

Staff of S.S.D.E. may use their mobile phones or earphones or headphones only during non-working hours.

Staff of S.S.D.E. and trainees should strictly not post/share any indecent message or photo or video pertaining to the Department or the L.T.I. and its activities on social media OR with anyone without seeking permission of the Principal or the Director as applicable. Due action as per law/rule will be taken against violators.

#### **♦ CONSUMPTION AND POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO/CIGARETTA/PAK MADDI, DRUGS**

Consumption and possession of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, pan masala, and smoking in any form by the staff or trainees while in the office OR in the L.T.I. campus is strictly prohibited. Due action as per law/rule will be taken against violators and further, if any trainee is found in possession or consuming alcohol, drugs, cigarette/cigaretts or any other banned substance, he/she will be struck-off from the roll of L.T.I.

#### **♦ WARNING MEMORANDUM, SUSPENSION, STRUCK-OFF FROM TRAINING**

As per D.G.T. guidelines, a trainee with less than 80% attendance at the end of the academic session/training period shall not be eligible to appear for the final examinations. Hence, a trainee with less than 80% attendance at any given time during the course of training will be issued with first warning Memorandum, followed by a second one if there is no improvement. Copies of the Warning Memorandum will be sent to his/her parents/guardians for information. However, if the trainee is found to be not showing any further improvement OR remains absent/absconding from training continuously for a period of 10 days without any intimation OR indulges in acts of indiscipline and misconduct, he/she shall be discharged/struck-off from the Institute by issuing a struck off order, copy of which will also be provided to all the concerned instructors and the trainee's parents/guardians for information.

If any investigations of allegations against a trainee suspected to be involved in acts of indiscipline or misconduct are pending, the trainee shall be placed under suspension and no attend/achharavitho shall be paid to the trainee who has been suspended for misconduct.

## EXAMINATIONS

### ANNUAL EXAMINATIONS

Annual examinations are conducted under the aegis of N.C.V.T./S.C.V.T. for the trainees admitted in C.T.S. trades every year on completion of training as per the trade syllabus of first year/second year/respective training period (as applicable) at the end of the same seasonal year/period or as declared in the course of time by D.S.T. Trainees of two-year duration trades have to appear in annual exams.

Trainees are allowed to appear in the All India Trade Test (A.I.T.T.) for a total of 04 attempts only (one regular and three consecutive supplementary examinations). For counting the number of attempts made by a trainee, the regular examination conducted for him/her batch (defined by the year of admission) will be considered as an attempt for him/her irrespective of him/her being full/partly fall/absent/ineligible in that examination. Subsequently, he/she will be allowed to appear in only three consecutive (successive) supplementary examinations held/notified by the D.S.T. If a trainee does not successfully pass the A.I.T.T. in the provided four attempts (one regular and three consecutive supplementary examinations), the name of the trainee will be struck-off from the panel. Such trainees will need to apply afresh for the admission if he/she desires. For a "two-year" course, a trainee will be permitted to attempt the last i.e. the third supplementary attempt for the second-year examination only if he/she has already passed the first-year exam.

The All India Trade Test (A.I.T.T.) examination pattern is also followed for the trades under S.C.V.T. All the examinations are conducted as per the applicable norms, which may be revised from time-to-time.

## INTERNAL EXAMS

Internal quarterly exams are conducted for Annual Pattern modes under C.T.S. Marks scored in above exams are considered as Formative Assessment marks.

## POST L.T.I. OPPORTUNITIES

### 1. DIRECT ADMISSION TO SECOND YEAR IN POLYTECHNIC INSTITUTES

The Government of Goa has provided vertical mobility option for L.T.I. pass-outs who are interested in pursuing higher studies through the Polytechnic Institutes available in Goa. A candidate who has passed S.S.C. and the qualifying examination of a two-year trade from any of the L.T.I.s in Goa functioning under the Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship can directly get admission in the second year of respective Diploma course as mentioned against the L.T.I. courses listed in the table below, subject to fulfillment of other admission criteria specified in the Prospectus of Directorate of Technical Education for admission to Polytechnic. The number of seats allotted every year to L.T.I. trainees in each Diploma course are as mentioned in the table below, which may change at the discretion of Directorate of Technical Education.

## 2. JOINING ADVANCED C.L.T.S. SKILL COURSE IN N.S.T.I.

L.T. pass-out interested in pursuing any long-term advanced skills course available under the Craft Instructor Training Scheme (CITS) in various National Skill Training Institutes (N.S.T.I.) (formerly Advanced/Craftsman Training Institutes) across the country which function under the Government of India, may visit C.I.T. Website at <https://00g.gov.in/CITS> for details, check the list of courses and

eligibility criteria of each, admission process, etc. and job related course. On successful completion of the DTS course, the candidates will get an opportunity to join any I.T.I. as a Vocational Instructor subject to fulfillment of other selection criteria. Candidates with experience also have the option to complete C.I.T.S. under the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) mode.

### **3. UNDERGOING APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING IN GOVERNMENT OR PRIVATE ESTABLISHMENT**

An I.T.I. pass-out on successful completion of a N.C.V.T. or S.C.V.T. affiliated course is eligible to join as an Apprentice in any of the Government or Private Establishments covered under the Apprentices Act, 1961 and registered on the Apprenticeship portal. He/she can undergo Designated/Optional Apprenticeship Trade-Training offered by such Establishments on their shop-floors/offices. Such trainees are also eligible to avail training-period rebate corresponding to the period spent by them while undergoing training in the Industrial Training Institutes and so are required to undergo training in the Establishments for the remaining Apprenticeship Training period as specified against the corresponding trade.

Trainees so engaged as Apprentices in the Establishments are eligible to be paid a minimum monthly stipend as per the qualifications stipulated in the curriculum.

Some Private Sector Establishments pay stipend over and above the minimum rate of stipend payable to apprentices per month.

#### **Eligibility Criteria for Candidates to Apply & Undergo Apprenticeship Training:**

Any individual who has completed 14 years of age (12 years in case of Hazardous Industries defined under the Apprenticeship Rules) and possesses minimum educational qualification prescribed for a trade can undergo apprenticeship training.

### **4. ACADEMIC EQUIVALENCE TO I.T.I. COURSES**

The Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in its meeting held on 23/09/2018 has decided to grant academic equivalence to courses conducted under Craftsmen Training Scheme and under N.C.V.T./S.C.V.T. at the I.T.I. is subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The students who after passing Std VIII, complete an I.T.I. course of 2 years duration from a recognized Institute and pass the N.C.E.T./S.C.E.T. examination with prescribed syllabus, and on their own volition appear and pass the S.S.C. (10<sup>th</sup>) examination conducted by the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in the subjects: (i) Language-I (ii) Language-II (Language-III prescribed by the Goa Board, shall be considered equivalent to have passed S.S.C. Examination.

The students who complete a recognized I.T.I. course of one-year duration and also complete one-year apprenticeship training OR certified employment are also extended with the same facility.

These students can then continue formal education using the S.S.C. pass certificate subject to admission being granted by respective college/institute.

- (ii) The students who after passing Std X complete an I.T.I. course of 2 years duration from a recognised Institute and pass the N.C.V.T./S.C.V.T. examination with prescribed syllabus, and on their own volition appear and pass the H.S.S.C./10<sup>th</sup> Std. examination conducted by the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in the subjects: 1) Language I/ Communication Skill in English 2) Language-II prescribed by the Goa Board shall be considered equivalent to have passed H.S.S.C. examination.

For the above purpose, the candidates have to register themselves as Private Candidates offering isolated subjects, who have passed S.S.C. and completed I.T.I. fulfilling other conditions as laid down at III above.

For details on Academic Equivalence to I.T.I. courses, interested students should approach the Goa Board and collect application forms from there, which have to be filled and submitted along with supporting documents first to the I.T.I. from where he/she has passed for onward submission to the Examination Section at the S.S.S.E. Head Office for verification and approval, and finally to the Goa Board for acceptance and granting permission to appear for the respective examination.

#### **5. OPT FOR VERTICAL MOBILITY COURSES GRANTED BY GOA UNIVERSITY TO I.T.I. PASSEDITS**

The Academic Council of Goa University has permitted vertical mobility to students who after passing Std X have completed an I.T.I. Course of two years duration (which has Std X as the eligibility/entry qualification) from recognised centers/institutions and passed the National/State Council of Vocational Training (N.C.V.T./S.C.V.T.) examinations of prescribed syllabus, and on their own volition have appeared and passed the examination conducted by the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in the subjects of English/Communication Skills for Std XI as prescribed by the Goa Board.

The eligibility for joining a particular program under the formal education system will however be decided by the respective educational institutions based on earlier Circulars issued on the subject matter.

Important Notice issued by Directorate General of Training (D.G.T.), Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, New Delhi pertaining to admissions in I.T.I.s are mentioned below for attention of admission seekers to National Council for Vocational Training (N.C.V.T.) approved trades in Government and Private I.T.I.s:

1. All admission seekers to N.C.V.T. approved trades (Engineering/Non-Engineering) are advised in their own interest to confirm and verify themselves before seeking admission to any trade that the respective trade/unit in the Government/Private Industrial Training Institute (I.T.I.) is affiliated to N.C.V.T. Only the trainees seeking admission to the trade/unit which is found to be affiliated under N.C.V.T. as on the date of admission are eligible to appear for the All India Trade Test (AITT) under N.C.V.T. and to be awarded with National Trade Certificate.
2. Affiliates of affiliated trades/units conducted in each Institute is available in the respective Institute and the State Directorate. It is also informed in the interest of the general public that N.C.V.T. or Government of India does not recognize any Government and Private Industrial Training Institute. N.C.V.T. affiliates only the trades and its units run by a particular I.T.I. No admission is allowed in N.C.V.T. trades without affiliation.

The candidates who desire to take admission in I.T.I.s may also note that the trades/units mentioned in Annexure-I, II and V which are currently offered under N.C.V.T. are subject to compliance to revised guidelines issued by Directorate General of Training (D.G.T.), New Delhi, Inter-alia stipulating that the trades/units whose period of N.C.V.T. affiliation has exceeded five years, would need to be re-affiliated to N.C.V.T. While efforts are being made to re-affiliate such trade/units to N.C.V.T., it may take considerable time. In the event of the N.C.V.T. re-affiliation process of such trades/units not being completed in time, the admission to these trades/units would be offered under State Council for Vocational Training (S.C.V.T.) and S.C.V.T. would accordingly conduct the final trade test and issue Certificate to all the successful candidates.

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

## AGE

All candidates having minimum age of 14 years and above as on the first day of the academic session 2025-

26 shall be eligible to seek admission in any of the trades, except for (i) Driver cum Mechanic and Drive Plant (L) trades for which the candidate should be minimum 18 years of age as on the first day of the academic session 2023-24 and for (ii) Drive Technician trade, for which the candidate should be minimum 18 years of age on the first day of the academic session 2023-24.

### PHYSICAL FITNESS

On admission to any course, a candidate is required to produce Medical Certificate issued by a Registered Medical Practitioner stating that he/she is fit to undergo training in the respective trade.

The candidate seeking admission in Fire Technology and Industrial Safety Management trade should have the following minimum physical requirements: Height - 165 cm, Weight - 52 kg, Chest - Normal 81 cm, Expanded 87 cm and produce a Medical Certificate issued by a registered MBBS doctor stating that the candidate is medically fit to undertake the course.

### BONIFIDE

The candidate should produce Residence Certificate issued by a Mamlatdar stating that he/she has been residing in Goa for a period of minimum 10 years or above preceding the date of the application.

A candidate may also produce Leaving/ Bonafide certificate issued by the school/college indicating the period of continuous schooling which should be minimum 10 years or above preceding the date of the application. In case, there is any major break in the education, even though the residence was continued in the State of Goa, then, candidate would be required to produce documentary evidence or a certificate issued by the Mamlatdar stating that during the said break period, he/she was in Goa and has fulfilled requirement of continuous residence in Goa for the particular period.

- a) Relaxation in 10 years of residence certificate for \*orphans, destitute children will be provided based on certificate issued by Government recognized Institute/Board or on submission of self-declaration form in Annexure D form which is appended at the end of this Prospectus.

## RAGGING

**Ragging in any form is banned and punishable.** The contents of the Goa Prohibition of Ragging Act, 2008 (Goa Act 9 of 2008) / Chapter No.15/DOCT/EST/SPRA/2016, Part 2884 dated 18/07/2016 issued by this Directorate with regards to ban on ragging are produced below for easy reference of all:

The Goa Prohibition of Ragging Act, 2008 (Goa Act 9 of 2008) has made it mandatory for all educational institutions to compulsorily display some of its main contents on the Notice Board which is as mentioned below:

304 Act 9 of 2008 2 (a) "ragging" means any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student indulging in rovery or mischievous activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment or adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

### 2. Anti-ragging movement—

(i) During admission process, the Prospectus, form for admission and/ or any other literature issued to the applicants for admission the prospectus shall clearly mention that ragging is banned in the institution and anyone indulging in ragging is likely to be punished.

(ii) The application form for admission/enrollment shall have a printed undertaking to be filled up and signed by the student to the effect that he/she is aware of the institution's approach towards ragging and the punishments to which he/she will be liable if found guilty of ragging. A similar undertaking shall be secured from the parent/guardian of the student. (Affidavits to be filed by the student and by his/her parent/guardian are appended as Annexure VII and Annexure VIII below.)

(iii) The educational institution shall display on the notice board, the name and addresses and contact numbers of the persons to whom the fresher in the institution should approach for help and guidance for various purposes keeping in view needs of fresher in the institution at the time of admission so that the fresher need not look up to the seniors for help in such matters and feel indebted to or obliged by them.

### [(A) — Monitoring cell, anti-ragging committee, etc. —

(1) Every educational institution shall have an **Anti-Ragging Committee** and an **Anti-Ragging Squad**. The Anti-Ragging Committee at the level of the institution shall consist of representatives of civil and police administration, local media, Non-Government Organizations involved in youth activities, representatives of faculty members, and representatives of parents, representatives of teachers, seniors and non-teaching staff. Each committee shall be headed by the Head of the educational institution.

(2) Anti-Ragging Squad, a body with vigil, oversight and patrolling functions should be nominated by the Head of the educational institutions with such representatives as considered necessary to keep it mobile, alert and active at all times. The Squad may be called upon to make surprise raids on hostels and other hot spots and shall be empowered to inspect places of potential ragging. The Squad shall work and shall be

empowered to inspect packs of potential ragging. The Squad shall not have any outside representation and shall consist of members belonging to the various sections of the campus community. There shall be diverse mix of membership in terms of levels as well as gender in both the Anti-Ragging Squad and the Anti-Ragging Committee.

**4. Prohibition of ragging—** Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited and no person shall commit, abet, propagate or participate in ragging within or outside of any educational institution.

**5. Authority to impose penalties —** The candidates seeking admission in U.T. I & II and their parents/guardians are required to submit duly filled affidavit (Annexure VII & VIII) at the time of seeking admission to U.T. I & II. Whenever any student or as the case may be complains in writing of ragging to the Head of the educational institution, the Head of the institution shall within seven days of the receipt of the complaint inquire into the complaint and if, a time facts any complaint is found true, should resort to disciplinary action at his/her level.

Apart from the above guidelines each trainee would be required to strictly abide by the rules and regulations issued by the individual institute from time-to-time to maintain a disciplined and conducive environment for imparting quality training.

#### **6. Punishment—**

(1) Whoever, directly or indirectly, commits, participates in, abets or propagates, ragging, within or outside any educational institution, shall, on conviction, be dealt with by the Head of the educational institution by resorting to disciplinary action.

(2) If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment should be resorted to so as to act as a deterrent punishment and to ensure collective pressure on the potential raggars.

(3) Any student so convicted shall further be removed from the roll of the educational institution and such students shall not be admitted in any other educational institution in the State of Goa for a period of three years from the date of such conviction.
